Does Your Class Need a (Hapara) Tune-Up?

Recently several Hapara users (Grades 6-12) have reported not being able to "see" several students in a given class. With the recent update to the software - coupled with the large number of student devices in our secondary schools - there are bound to be a few issues.

If you have student devices that do not appear to be recognized or are "not connected" here are a few tips that might help out:

- 1. Restart the student device. Often times students do not shut down Chromebooks at all for weeks at a time. A restart is usually required for updates to take effect. This is always a quick way to cure a lot of problems.
- 2. Follow these steps from the Hapara Interact Troubleshooting Guide:
 - Log into Google or Chrome browser under one of your student's user accounts, or just have the student log in and hand over the device, using the same device in the same location usually used by your student.
 - Browse to the URL https://rc.hapara.com/diagnostics
 - Open the diagnostics module by clicking on the Hapara icon displayed in the right-hand side of the address bar as shown below:



- If this icon doesn't appear on the student device, make sure the Hapara Interact Extension is installed and enabled by following the instructions HERE
- Begin your tests by clicking the button 'Run Diagnostic Tests' in your diagnostics pop-up window.
 - Once tests are complete, refer to the <u>Troubleshoooting Guide</u>, <u>part 2</u>: <u>Interpreting the Results</u> for tips on correcting the issue.

Learn 360 - It's Still Here!

Learn 360 is an instructional video resource that DIstrict #205 has enjoyed for several years. (This service is a similar to Discovery Streaming, which many have heard of elsewhere.) Discovery Streaming allows teachers to search for & download video resources from many popular sources, including PBS, BBC America, National Geographic, The History Channel, and many others!

Videos can be downloaded in .WMV format to play over teacher workstations/classroom projectors. Videos can also be streamed in MP4 format for use on mobile devices. However, for instructional purposes, downloading the video to your workstation and saving it will allow you to keep it for easy access in the future.

Our subscription to this service will continue into the next school year. (2015-2016) Contact Matt and make sure to include your name & building assignment to receive your passcode to access these curriculum support resources!

PARCC Update

High School students enrolled in Algebra 2 and/or English 11 this semester will complete the PBA test during the last week of April. All student in Grades 3-8, along with these high school students, will also complete the End of Year (EOY) test during the month of May. Results from all of these tests will be aggregated into a score report after completion. Recent communications from ISBE indicate the earliest we should expect to see these results may be some time in September. We'll keep you posted.

School Test Coordinators (usually building administrators) are now checking through students' Personal Needs Profiles to make sure they receive appropriate accommodations & accessibility features, like text-to-computer-speech, human read-aloud, etc. Some Accessibility Features do not require IEPs or 504 plans! Consult the Accessibility & Accommodations manual for details. Please assist by clearly communicating student needs to your School Test Coordinator as soon as possible.

PARCC Schedules

School Test Coordinators set PARCC testing schedules for each building. On the technical end of things, however, we have very recently learned that we must purge all Performance Based Assessment (PBA) content from our server before we load up the End of Year (EOY) testing content. This requires that Grades 3-8 wait until the PBA testing is completed at the high school before EOY testing can begin elsewhere. Please understand that this process will take some time and testing by our Tech Department to ensure everything is ready to go, which normally takes a day or so. We thank you for your understanding and flexibility during this first year of PARCC. It is a learning process for everyone.

Funding for National Board Candidates Released

Recently ISBE announced that funding has been released to help support teachers wishing with pursue National Board Certification:

The Illinois State Board of Education is pleased to announce the opening of the 2015 Spring Window for the Illinois \$1,900 NBPTS Candidate Fee Subsidy.

The <u>National Board Resource Center at Illinois State University</u> will process applications for eligible Illinois teachers. Funding has been made available for 500 candidates. Please invite an outstanding teacher or counselor to become a National Board Certified Teacher by forwarding this message to them and adding a personal note of encouragement.

National Board Certification offers a way for accomplished teachers to be assessed and recognized, and a way for parents to know their child's teacher has met high and rigorous

standards. The single most important action the nation can take to improve schools is to strengthen teaching. NBPTS develops high and rigorous standards for accomplished teachers and 100,000 teachers across the country and 6,025 teachers in Illinois have demonstrated that they meet those standards by achieving National Board Certification.

National Board Certified Teachers are among the nation's most effective teachers who have demonstrated that they meet the highest teaching standards.

The NBPTS certification process takes from one to three years to complete. Throughout this period, candidates:

- Analyze and reflect on student learning, based on small and large group work with students, which is supported by video recordings of classroom teaching.
- Analyze and reflect on student learning using student work samples.
- Document accomplishments of working with families and the community, colleagues and the profession and show evidence of how that work impacts student learning.
- Respond to online assessment exercises that demonstrate subject-matter expertise.
